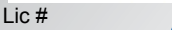

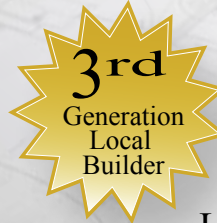

Hurricane Season

The 2013 hurricane season is here. For your safety be prepared for the possible worst. LaCasa is a mandatory evacuation community. That means if a Category 1 storm is in the Gulf and has a chance of impacting the Port Charlotte and Sarasota County areas we will be under mandatory evacuations. Have a plan for where you are going.

Are you a special medical needs resident or mobility needs, and if so have you registered with Sarasota County for special needs help? Medical evacuation forms are available at our Office and also with Mary Borst, our special needs coordinator. We want to thank you, Mary, for stepping forward and being involved with a very important task in our community. It is very important that our residents pre-register with the County if you require any kind of special needs if an evacuation becomes necessary.

High Wind Concerns

Have you had the tie downs under your home checked and upgraded? After many years the straps become rusted and break. You may need to add some strapping to better secure your home for everyone's safety. Have you also checked your carport support posts? Are the top and bottom zinc coated bolts rusted? They may need to be replaced and a strapping cable may be added to enhance the cover's ability to handle high winds.

During the high winds of a hurricane or even at times in the afternoon with thunder storms, loose items in the yards and carports can be blown around. Suddenly the aluminum or PVC lawn chair, plastic or potted plant, even loose lumber or other items can become deadly, damaging property or life threatening projectiles. This is one of the many reasons a rule exists about cluttered carports and unsecured lawn ornaments. Whether you plan to be in Florida year round or if you head north for a time, please remember to keep unsecured, loose items inside, and if you know a hurricane is predicted to come our way, pull everything inside and evacuate if directed.

Please remember **NONE OF LA CASA BUILDINGS ARE EVACUATION CENTERS.** Do not plan on sitting out the storm in the Club House or Rec Hall or the Activity Building. Remember when high winds hit a sustained 40 MPH all emergency response personnel are kept in the shelters until the storm blows over. In other words

you are on your own. For your safety, please go to a shelter!

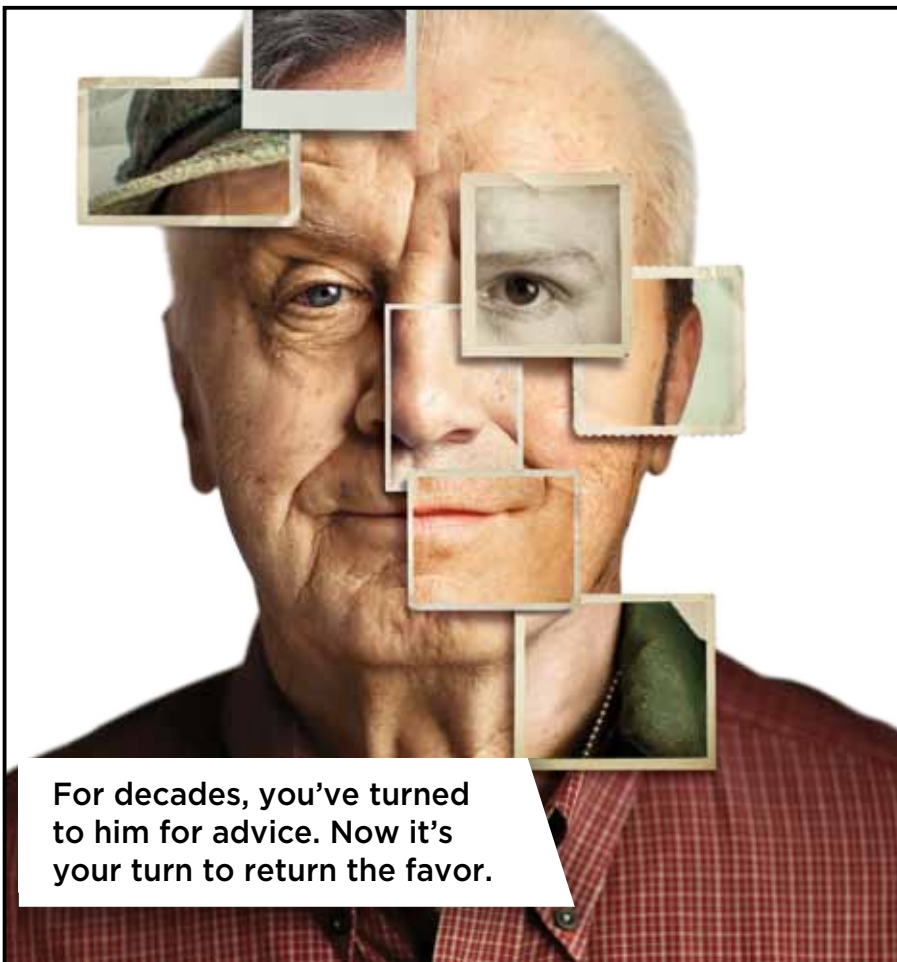

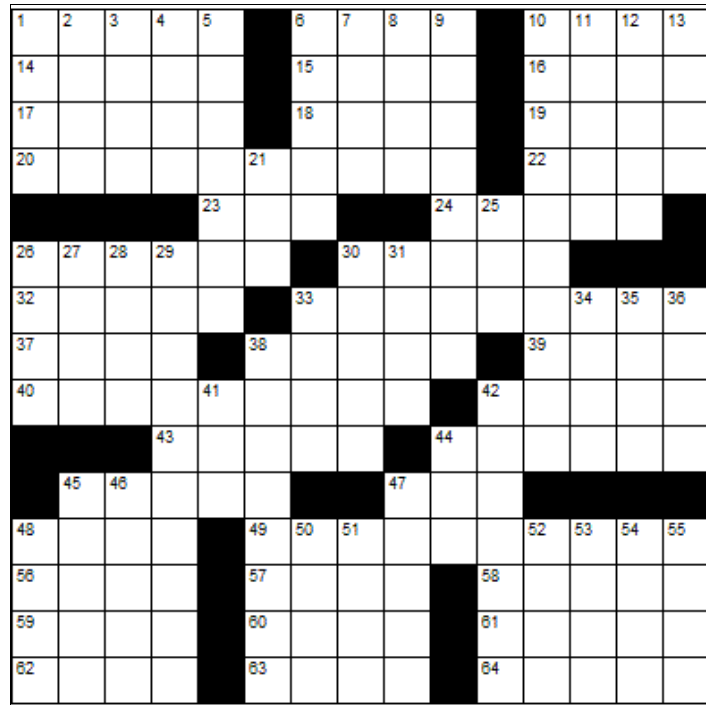

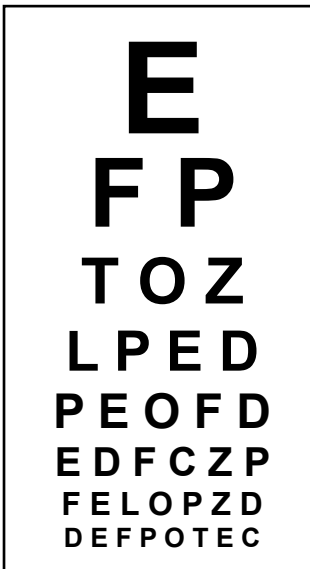

News from our HOA Treasurer

By the time you read this, the "dog days of August" will be upon us. The rain has eased, but not the heat and humidity. I hope everyone is enjoying their summer. We had a great Fourth of July with the parade and picnic. We went to Lemon Bay for the fireworks and they were spectacular.

I thought we might discuss the physical assets in our park this month. In April you might have seen a fellow taking pictures, measuring and wandering around the park. He was taking an inventory of our assets for the purpose of evaluating our current level of insurance. We got a preliminary report in May and it is very illuminating. Not surprisingly, the Rec Hall was the most valuable building at \$1.4 million, but guess what the next most valuable item was. I'll bet no one picked Electric Pedestals -- you know, those posts in your backyard with the meter for FPL. I always thought they belonged to FPL, but guess again. In fact electric pedestal replacement consumes almost \$50K a year in reserve funds and will for the next 10-15 years. FPL has determined that all of them must be replaced ASAP, but we can't do them all in one or two years, so we're updating on an as needed basis. Who would have ever thought?

Naturally, the other buildings (club house, activity, maintenance, etc.) comprise the bulk of our valuation (\$2.1 million), but another thing I found that surprised me was the main wall along US 41 is made of Styrofoam and covered over with adobe and was worth \$35K. Styrofoam?? Really?? Who thought of that? Our flat surface courts are pretty valuable, too. Over \$500K for the tennis courts, bocce, putting green and shuffleboard courts. Speaking of which, do we really need shuffleboard courts and laundry facilities at the Club House? Can we put the space to better use? Let me know. The pools, spas and fencing are \$475K. No wonder they get used so much. Anyway, the whole kit and caboodle of our park is worth \$6.1 million dollars.

That figure is being discussed with our insurance company so our coverage can be adjusted either up or down to get the most bang for our buck. You can see that our physical assets are very valuable and need to be protected in the event of a catastrophic event. More on insurance in the future. Talk to you next month.

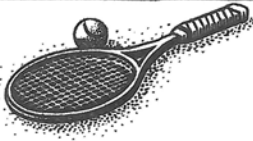

As directed by the President and/or the Board, the Secretary shall handle official correspondence; maintain a current membership register, and a record of all committees and members thereof. **The Secretary may also temporarily handle the treasurer's duties in the short-term absence of the treasurer.**

3. Article VI Duties of the Officers (Addition of last sentence)

Section 4 The Treasurer shall receive, disperse and report all funds of the Tennis Club and maintain the records thereof in accordance with accepted accounting procedures. **"In the absence of the Treasurer, the Board may appoint a temporary replacement to fill the position.**
