

TRASH COLLECTION SCHEDULE

Trash collection hours change, so get your garbage out in COVERED containers the night before, to keep out our night visitors.

<u>Tuesday:</u> House Trash, Boxes, Recyclables



<u>Recycling:</u> Cardboard MUST be broken down, collapsed or flattened and put INSIDE your blue Recycle Bins.

Wednesday: Yard Waste by 8 am. Put it in 32 gallon containers or bag it using sturdy 32 gallon plastic trash bags. Bundle limbs and branches and tie with heavy string. Remove fruit from branches, fruit goes in with house trash. Do NOT use cardboard boxes as containers. Do NOT stack yard waste by utility poles, mail boxes, water connections, or fire hydrants.

Friday: House trash only, no recycles.

Note: If you have neighbors who have difficulty taking out their trash, or picking up their newspapers, give them a hand; a quiet act of kindness makes you feel better and helps them so many ways. Thank you.

When trash day falls on a holiday: No pick up on that day, but the next day.

THE BACK GATE IS FOR RESIDENTS ONLY

At the back gate there is a sign posted that vendors should use the entrance on Route 301. On September 20th, a Manatee Furniture truck tailgated behind another vehicle and of course, the bar came down, was damaged and in turn the company was sent a bill for \$300. If you have anyone come to your house in our community, and they are using a GPS system, they should use the address for the front gate, not your home address; otherwise, they will get directions to enter the back gate on Mendoza road. Pass this information to your friends, neighbors and Furniture Delivery Company and others. The address is for non-residents is: 7004 U.S. 301 North, Ellenton, Florida 34222. Please do not open the back gate for anyone, unless you know they live here. This is important for the safety of our residents.

VISITORS' PASSES FOR THE GATE

If you have visitors who just want to visit for a few days, or a week or two, ask the gate house for a form to fill out, so that your company can have a pass which can be longer than the one day pass, normally issued by the gate keepers. Fill out the form, have it signed and return it to the gate keeper.

FREE SECURITY SURVEY OF YOUR HOME

You can call Deputy Alan Fifield in the Crime Prevention Department at 747-3011 ext: 2588 and he will give you advice on what you need to do to make your home safer. Of course it is important that we report any suspicious people or activities in our community. Be a nosey neighbor.

DOG OWNERS

Dog owners are reminded that their dogs should be kept on a short leash, not the ones that retract to any length. Maximum length is 6 feet. The owners are responsible for picking up after their dogs, even at night. If you do not pick up after your dog, you will be fined; this is a Florida State law, not just our rule. If you take your dog out in your golf cart, please be sure that your cart has a RHO sticker on the front and the unit number on the back.

ACCORDING TO MANATEE SHERIFF'S DEPT WE NO LONGER CAN DRIVE OUR CARTS TO K-MART WITHOUT THE RISK OF A WARNING BUT WE CAN DRIVE THEM TO THE LIBRARY, ACE HARDWARE, POST OFFICE, AND THE BANK. MAKE SURE YOU HAVE INSURANCE ON YOUR CARTS BECAUSE ANY ACCIDENTS YOU WILL BE RESPONSIBLE.

KNOW THE SIGNS OF A STROKE: ACT: F.A.S.T.

S: SPEECH: Ask the person to repeat a simple phrase. Does the speech sound slurred or strange?

T: TIME: If you observe any of these signs, its' time to CALL 9-1-1.

Build A Kit

(These items are recommended whether you choose to shelter at home or travel out of the area)

- 1-gallon of water per person per day Keep at least a 7-day supply
- 3-day supply of non-perishable food
- Manual can opener
- Portable, battery-operated radio
- Extra batteries
- Flashlight
- First Aid kit
- Personal hygiene items (toothpaste, toothbrush, deodorant, moist towelettes, feminine hygiene items, etc.)
- Clothing-at least one change per person

- Sanitation supplies (toilet paper, plastic garbage bags, disinfectant, bleach, etc.)
- Blankets or sleeping bags
- Basic tools
- Whistle or signal flare
- Infant Supplies (diapers, wipes, formula, baby food, medications, etc.)
- Adult special needs items (Minimum 3-day supply of prescription medications and insulin, denture needs, contact lenses & supplies, special diet products, adult diapers, etc.)
- Sturdy shoes or work boots

Do No Forget To Include

- Cash
- Important Family Documents Will, insurance policies, contracts, deeds, stocks an bonds, social security cards, passports, immunization records, credit card and bank account information, etc.







What To Bring To The Red Cross Shelter

- Prescription & non-prescription medications
- List with emergency contact information (doctor and family phone numbers)
- Address labels or those of your mobile home park
- Comfortable folding chair
- Washable blanket & pillow (Sleeping Bag)
- Cot, mat or air mattress to sleep on
- Clothing for 2 days
- Sweatshirt, shoes, rain gear
- Personal hygiene items (travel size)
- Moist Towelettes (there are no showers)
- Flashlight and extra batteries

- Books, games, cards or puzzles
- Headphones for radio or electronics
- Ear plugs
- Snacks (shelter supplies moderate portion meals)
- Infant Supplies (diapers, baby wipes, formula, baby food, medications, etc.)
- Adult Special Needs Items (adult diapers, wipes, medications, insulin, denture and contact supplies, etc.)

Fanny packs or backpacks recommended over purse.

June has been a tough month for golf, with plenty of rain, graduations and some warm humid weather cutting into our ranks. We have had between 4 and 6 golfers arrive for our tee times, starting at 9:32am Tuesdays at the Links. Most of the time, we have been able to get out earlier, as all the crowds have thinned. The course is in very good condition, rains and warmer weather have helped the grass and greens. Sadly, scores have not improved, but maybe next week.

To continue with the review of courses in Manatee and Sarasota, this past month I played the Rolling Green Golf Club, located at 4501 Tuttle Ave. in Sarasota and Waterlefe Golf and River Club at 1022 Fish Hook Cove in East Bradenton.

First, Rolling Green. The course does not have Senior Tees, so again I played White at 5680 yards. That is a little more than the 5004 yards at Greenfield. The course is in very good condition, with good grass, medium rough and excellent greens. Some greens are a bit small, but this improves the challenge. The course is mostly flat and straight with two small dogleg holes and little water coming into play. The course is more mature, with lots of trees to avoid just off the fairways, or in the fairways. Concrete cart paths are on all holes. Longest hole is 475 yards with the par 3's a bit long between 145 and 158 yards. Was an enjoyable experience and I will return.

Second, Waterlefe. The course has Senior Tees listed at 5474 yards. Played the white at 5951. Was unfortunate to play within a few days of aeration, so the greens were a bit rough. Water comes into play on all holes. The course is one of the most beautiful I've played. Fairways, rough and greens (save the sand filled holes) were in great shape. Longest hole was 494 yards. Par 3's from 141-170 vards. Yes, 170... Rough was deeper than Greenfield or Rolling Green. Actually my club went completely under the ball on one shot. Paths again on each hole, though some are stone. This course has the most difficult par 3 hole I've played. Number 15, at 149 yards, has no fairway, just scrub you can not enter. There is little grass to the sides of the green and woods behind. This is a challenging course and I recommend it to our more accomplished, lower handicap golfers.

For any of you who wish to join us, please feel free to come out. We are still gathering for breakfast at Popi's, so join us or just show up at the Links at the Greenfield course. Coming earlier than our regular 9:32 tee time on Tuesday will get us done earlier.


