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

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## **BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE**

In past years the Beautification Committee has had to react to the situations caused by severe weather catastrophes that would dictate what projects we would have to focus on versus picking specific fun tasks.

This season the Beautification Committee has only had a few requests for assisting residents with landscaping and other cleanup items over the past few months. I recently published, that we would be working on the pavilion to do some repairs and give it a major make-over. Not sure if this falls under Beautification as I had many more volunteers asking if they could help than needed. We tapped into several volunteers with carpentry expertise as we would be replacing rotted roof panels, installing six new vents for ventilation, replacing fascia boards, soffits and finally installing a new metal roof over the existing shingle roof.

This project will continue in stages with the next three phases including new electric recessed lighting and fans. Next a paint job for a clean new look and finally masonry work around the support posts for additional structure.

Even though the long range plan was to remove the existing pavilion, relocate and replace with a brand new unit, the cost for this would push the project out for a number of additional years. So the direction was changed to repair the damaged pavilion and make it useable for the next several years to come. When complete I believe this will once again give residents a beautiful retreat near the pools out of the sun to relax and enjoy.

With funds depleted over the past several years due to hurricane repairs, we will be selective as to taking on any major projects in the near future. That being said, we will still try to assist any residents with requests for physical help on their property.

Later this spring, we have a new landscaping company that will donate efforts and funds to beautify our park entrance to make it even more inviting.

If you know of any residents that truly need help with any items at their property, please feel free to contact me. Sometimes, it may be beyond what we can do but that can only be determined after a request is made.

If you are willing to get involved, the Beautification Committee is a great group to join.

Generally, the time commitment is minimal. We work hard but have a lot of fun in the process.



## Storage Compound News

The storage compound bills went out in December this year so confirming payment on our occupancy will not be completed until late February. I know many of you found it somewhat confusing since the mailing of invoices did not indicate that a renewal of the storage compound contract and copies of proof of registration and insurance was still required. It is always required every year. I tried to soften the situation by trying to suggest getting the contract form off of Pitera, but likely it was too late for most who had efficiently and dutifully sent in their checks already. I hope by now we have the documents needed by the office. I am hoping by next year we can modernize the system to have the contract that can be filled out on line and maybe documents submitted that way as well, I think most of us can handle that and it would be a big saving of paper and postage expense.

Most know that if you need to contact the storage compound volunteers you only need to call the dedicated cell phone. That number is listed in the Bulletin every month and is also on the sign just inside the gate which you can read from outside. When you call you get one of our experience and trained volunteers that will meet with you, assign spaces, supply contracts, answer questions, help you park, almost anything but take you to lunch. The "duty" is passed from week to week so you never know who you will speak to when you call but it will be one of your neighbors; Diane Aliperti, Doug Anderson, Robert Burton, Al Gyenese, Karl Fredrick, Bill Madden, Mark McGrath, or myself Alan Westerberg. This is the team that serves the community, helping with this amenity.

In the meantime, I have had a number of contract violations lately that we have had to address with compound space users. **Dogs running free**...we can not allow that because most of our users would not want to step in or lie in little piles of "stuff" while working on their stored equipment. Lots of **stored stuff not tied down or covered**....Your contract requires you to keep stuff secured and covered, loose material can be a real hazard in hurricanes or common thunderstorms damaging boats or breaking windshields. Its only common sense folks. **Subletting an assigned space**....Your contract does not allow you to let someone use your space when you have no need for it, with or without compensation. If you do not need your space, you must give it up then when you have a need in the future you can get a new space.

Please remember all boats, motor vehicles and RVs require current registration to be displayed on the equipment. Please affix your current registration stickers if you have not yet done so. If you get new equipment please let us know so we can affix a new permit identification sticker.

The storage compound phone number is 941-234-9062. If you need us call the cell during business hours. If the "duty officer" is not immediately available, please leave a message for a return call.

## Long Range Planning Committee Activity

In the past month it was hard not to notice the work on the old and hurricane damaged pool pavilion. Some may have found that surprising since it was voted to have it replaced and moved back corresponding with an increase in pool deck area. Well, you can blame it on Ian, Debbie, Helene, and Milton the four hurricanes experienced since 2022.

The pavilion and pool area project had just about completed the planning stage and contract estimates for its replacement when Ian arrived and our community has been struggling with infrastructure repairs ever since. Additionally, the marina had to be first in line for renovation since numerous docks had to be closed last year due to their deterioration. The combination of all reduced our spending power and put our pavilion and pool deck improvements on perpetual hold.

We could wait no longer, our new manager Wayne, came up with a renovation plan which was both affordable and attractive and our volunteers and employees banded together to reroof and renovate the current structure to be used for the near future. LRPC next steps in the process will be to confirm there is still interest in the relocation project originally planned and reset a new objective 3 to 5 years out if the support for the relocation and expansion still exists.

Historically the LRPC considers proposed enhancements, improvements and updates to maintain and improve the experience of the community members, often developed from input from the community. Then after review we make recommendations to the BOD for changes. At times we formed a sub committee to bring a project to completion.



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
