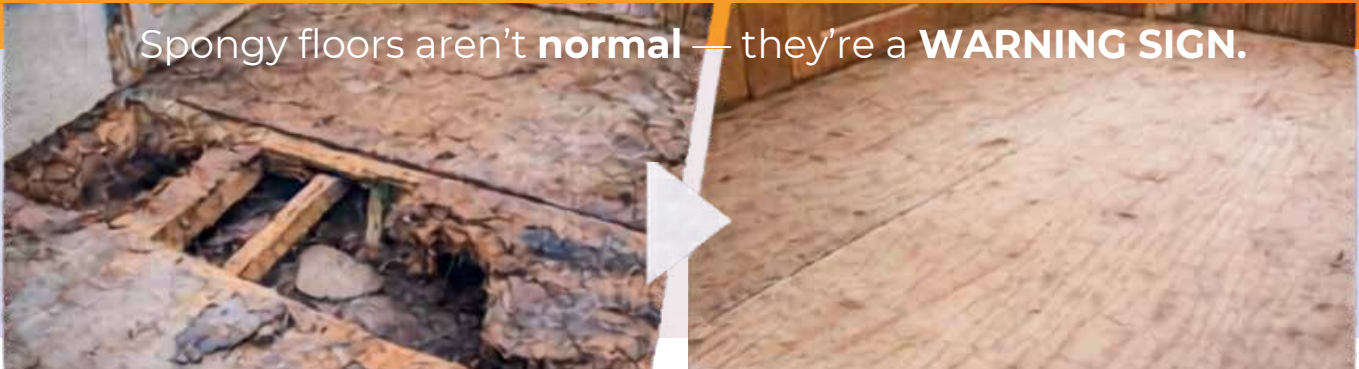

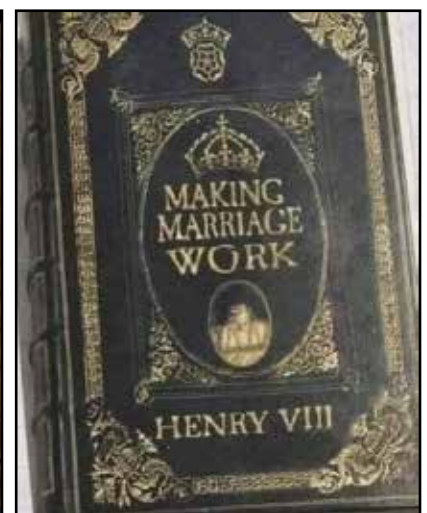

We had a wonderful time celebrating CCM's 33rd co-op anniversary on April 15 with a lively potluck dinner. The evening included trivia from 1993 and a fun refresher on the history of our community and Trout Lake—a great reminder of how far we've come together.

At the April 16 City Council Public Hearing, discussions focused on a proposal by Seidel Holdings, LLC, to change the land use designation for the property at 1539 North State Road 19. The intent was to build condos on five of the eighteen acres adjacent to our community. *The Osprey* is pleased to report that the proposal has been placed on pause while important concerns—particularly wetlands preservation and stormwater runoff—are addressed. Encouragingly, several commissioners emphasized the importance of protecting Trout Lake, which is no longer on the impaired list, as well as safeguarding the nearby Nature Center.

On another note, curiosity about artificial intelligence continues to grow. In *Adventures with Buddy Bot* (Part 1, Page 6), I share how I began exploring ChatGPT—quickly discovering how “Buddy Bot” became something of a super-brain companion. (Part 2, Page 11) takes a creative turn, showcasing some fun and imaginative photo effects.

JERRY AND WANDA WEISENREDER 4/11/26 At Saturday Coffee

Jerry and Wanda Weisenreder were snowbirds from New York’s Finger Lakes region, summering on Keuka Lake. Their CCM home had deep roots—it originally belonged to Wanda’s father, Doug Giles.

Jerry was a retired teacher, though “retired” hardly fit. He loved barbershop quartet singing and was likely CCM’s first barbershopper. Beginning around 1980, he gathered nearly 20 fellow residents—many of them teachers—into the fold, including Jerry LaDue, Andy Nazzaro, and Mike Morgan.

Was that the start of CCM’s strong upstate New York presence? Or just teachers sticking together? Either way, the community benefited—and that’s coming from a Michigander.

Jerry wasn’t just a leader—he was a character. Years earlier, he had lost his left leg below the knee in a tractor accident. True to form, he turned even that into something memorable. You might see him in the clubhouse, stretched out with his prosthetic foot turned backward—just long enough to make you look twice... and then laugh.

Then there was the painting day.

When the Men’s Club took on painting the Clubhouse—50 or 60 retirees determined to save money—showed up for the job. Jerry was up front while others worked around the building. At some point, the story began circulating from one man to the next: “Jerry Weisenreder dropped his leg off the roof and asked someone to throw it back up!”

By the time it made its way around, the place erupted—laughter, head-shaking, and a kind of joy that made the work feel lighter. Exactly what that crew needed. And knowing Jerry, you had to wonder... maybe that was the plan.

Wanda, meanwhile, was the heart of every room. Warm and genuine, she made people feel seen. Saturday morning coffee was her time—greeting those standing, then moving table to table with what became known as the “Wanda hug.” It wasn’t optional. People stood and waited their turn. It was as much a ritual as the Pledge of Allegiance.

Jerry’s health declined, and he passed away in October 2019 while they were up north. The following spring, word came that Wanda would return with her son—likely for one last visit. At Saturday coffee, an idea took shape: a “Hugs by Wanda” booth. Steve Reid’s daughter even made a sign.

When Wanda walked in, she found a table in the middle of the room with a large sign: “Hugs by Wanda.” And beside it—a line. Friends and neighbors, all waiting for one more hug. Wanda passed away before she could return the following fall.

How it works



Step 1: Identification of Unserviceable Flags

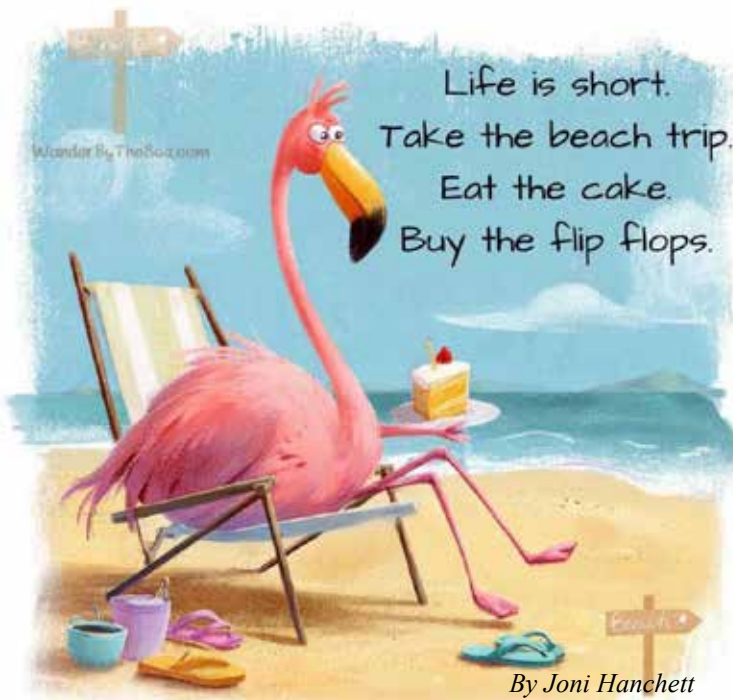
