



DON'T MISS A CALL, ALERT OR NOTIFICATION

Despite being attached to our phones, it is easy to miss an alert or notification of incoming calls or messages. For those who are hearing impaired or deaf, the risk of missing alerts or notifications is increased. Depending on your specific device, several setting options are likely already available on your phone that can increase the chances of your getting alerts or notifications by flashing or vibrating.

If you have an iPhone, you can use one of its settings to make it flash a bright LED light every time an alert or call comes in. This is a visible indicator, which can help those who are hard of hearing or deaf, have a better chance of knowing they received an alert or call. Here's how to enable LED flashes for alerts and calls:

- Open/Unlock your iPhone, and tap 'Settings'
- Scroll down and tap 'Accessibility'
- Scroll down and tap 'Audio & Visuals'
- Scroll down and tap 'LED Flash for Alerts'
- Toggle on each desired setting, such as LED Flash for Alerts, Flash While Unlocked, Flash in Silent Mode

Now, when you receive a call or alert on your iPhone, you will not just be dependent on sound or vibrations. You will see a very bright LED light flashing from your iPhone's camera flash.

Setting up your Android device to use the LED light for calls or notifications can significantly enhance your alert system, especially if you prefer visual cues over sound or vibration. A note here that while more recent models don't actually use LED, this feature is manifested in the camera flash feature. Here are some steps to help you enable this feature:

- Open Settings
- Scroll down and tap on "Accessibility."
- Choose "Advanced settings."
- Tap Flash notification
- Toggle on "Camera flash notification" for LED flash

How to spot it:

- Messages from "celebrities" promising rewards.
- Too-good-to-be-true investment opportunities you just can't miss.

How to protect yourself:

- Be wary of unsolicited friend requests.
- Never send money to someone you haven't met in real life.
- Report and block scam accounts.
- Verify the authenticity of profiles, and never click on links without independently confirming their legitimacy through trusted sources.
- Have strong antivirus software installed on all your devices

- 8oz. container Cool whip


Mix condensed milk, sour cream and Cool whip together, add fruit cocktail, pineapple, cherries and banana slices.



<u>A COUPLE HURRICANE</u> REMINDERS



- 1. Please evacuate if told to do so. Your well-being is more important than "stuff".
- 2. Check your yard for items that can turn into projectiles in a wind event. Please remove those items and place them in your shed or home.
- 3. Red and green sheets of paper were made available to residents to use for a code to the CERT. If you are safe after a major storm place a green sheet in a window facing the street indicating you are safe. A red sheet should go in the windows if you are in need of assistance. If you are leaving your home before a major storm, place a green sheet in the window to indicate there is no problem at your residence.

Let's hope that our community is spared from any hurricanes this season. Your CERT will be ready to go into action mode in the event we encounter a major storm.

IF IT IS TOO HOT FOR YOU IT IS **TOO HOT FOR THEM**

If you have a dog and walk her/ him keep in mind that the average high temp in our area in September is 93 with some days over 100. Concrete or



asphalt surfaces don't cool down a lot over night because the average cool temp is 76. The sun creates a frying pan effect "You can fry an egg on the sidewalk."

When you're walking on a hot day, check the asphalt with your bare feet. If it's too hot for you, it's too hot for your pooch. It might seem a little warm when you leave but it will be hotter when you get back.

Dogs who typically walk on grass or aren't very active will have more delicate paws. But even dogs accustomed to walking on rough surfaces are at risk for burns when walking on hot days. When you walk, make sure to always bring water and a bowl. A collapsible bowl will cost \$5 - \$15 for two on line and of course a little more at a local store.

One of the best ways to protect your pup's paw pads is also the easiest; frequently check them. Check for blisters, cuts, cracks, sores, or foreign objects that cause abrasions. You can purchase paw balm if their paws look sore.

Pad their paws with dog booties. Your dog may initially dislike wearing them but they will adjust the more they wear them. If you live in The Gardens, dog booties are an easy way to protect your dog's feet from hot pavement. When you buy booties the type with double Velcro straps is best. They will cost about \$35 on line or a little more at a local pet store.

CHECK IT OUT

If you hear something please check it out with the office (941-776-1252) before you talk with other residents about it. Rumors spread rapidly and many are NOT true and can hurt people in a brief period of time. The office should be the first and best source of community information.

SAFETY FIRST

Please make sure that your smoke alarms work properly. If they are more than 10 years old you should want to



replace them. One near your bedroom and one in the living area of your house is a good idea. It is also a good idea to have at least one working fire extinguisher in your house and also a fire blanket in or near your kitchen. TGHOA hopes to have the fire department come and make a presentation concerning this in the Fall.





Are you really the Lucky Winner?

Never **PAY** to get a **PRIZE**. That's a scam.

Don't pay to get a prize. Real prizes are free. Anyone who asks you to pay a fee for "taxes," "shipping and handling charges," or "processing fees" to get your prize, is a scammer. Stop and walk away.

Don't give your financial information. There is absolutely no reason to ever give your bank account or credit card number to claim a prize. If anyone asks for it, it's a scam.

Don't give your personal information. Scammers hope you'll click on links that will take your personal information or download malware on your device. Delete the message without clicking on the links and don't respond.

- ☐ Can opener (if kit contains canned food)
- ☐ Local maps
