

If you kept up with the forecast for Hurricane Erin, you would have noticed that it blossomed into a major storm in very short order. The quick intensifying of storms, which head our way, seems to be the norm over the past decade. This is why Management, the Board, and your local groups urge you to prepare yourselves for the worst and hope for the best. Please take advantage of the information as it becomes available to you. There are plenty of outlets by which you can prepare yourselves. Horizon Village will e-blast information as it becomes available to us.

Peter served in the U.S. Army Reserves from 1965-1971. He



In 1971, he was transferred to group headquarters where he became the Telecommunications Operations Manager. He retired as Chief Master Sargent. In 2016 a new law gave official veteran status to National Guard members who served 20 years or more.

8-DAY HURRICANE EVACUATION PLAN

Stu Cooke, Horizon Village Co-op Inc. President, 239-217-4843

The Co-op Board of Directors would like all residents to be prepared for the upcoming storm season. Please heed notices that are circulated by local media outlets, your Lee County agencies, and your community organizations. As recent storms have shown, your key to survival could very well rest upon your level of preparedness. The association cannot emphasize enough the importance of each unit taking stock, beforehand, of your supplies and the need for a plan to evacuate when the authorities give the order. Remember – **THE CLUBHOUSE WILL BE LOCKED** – prior to and during a major weather event. When winds become sustained FORTY miles per hour, first responders must wait for the passage of the storm. If you have an emergency, you will be on your own until the authorities declare it safe for teams to travel. The following guidelines could prove helpful:

If given notice of a storm's potential development, assess your supplies.

- 8 days out monitor the storm, check household supplies, locate a safe zone.
- 7 days out monitor the storm, check home safety features, check fuel levels, have cash on hand in the event of loss of power in the area.
- 6 days out monitor the storm, prepare your evacuation route.
- 5 days out monitor the storm, finalize safety plans, prepare your home.
- 4 days out monitor the storm, call contacts, evacuate if necessary.
- 3 days out monitor the storm from the location which you have chosen.
