U.S. Army



Jack served in the U.S. Army from 1961-1964. He was stationed at Fort Sill in Oklahoma and later in Germany. He was in Operations Intelligence in Artillery which includes, but not limited to, making informed decisions regarding counterinsurgency and stabilization of missions.



Peter Pazumas-Bodycomb
US Army Reserve



Peter served in the U.S. Army Reserves from 1965-1971. He was stationed at Camp Drum, near the western border of the state of New York. Peter was a clerk typist which includes, but not limited to, typing correspondence, endorsements, reports, and standard forms.



Lorrie Blanchard
U.S. Air Force



Lorrie served in the U.S. Air Force from 1954-1956. Her basic training was at Lackland Air Force Base in Texas, and she later served at Keesler Air Force Base in Biloxi, Mississippi. Lorrie was an Air Traffic Controller where she had to keep the planes safe and guided them at different stages of flight. Lorrie was also a member of the U.S. Air Force Basketball Team where they took home the team's championship in Colorado Springs, Colorado. Although Lorrie was very young, what inspired her to join the military was the death of her uncle in Normandy during World War II.

U.S. Air
National Guard



Sam served in the U.S. Air National Guard from 1950-1980. He joined the 267th Combat Communications Squadron. After two years it was attached to the 253rd Mobile Communication Group, located in Wellesley, MA along with squadrons from Maine, New York, and Pennsylvania. Their mission was "Recovery", and they trained one weekend a month in the armory and two weeks in the summer at various Air Force Bases on the East Coast. In 1971, he was transferred to group headquarters where he became the Telecommunications Operations Manager. He retired as Chief Master Sargent. In 2016 a new law gave official veteran status to National Guard members who served 20 years or more.

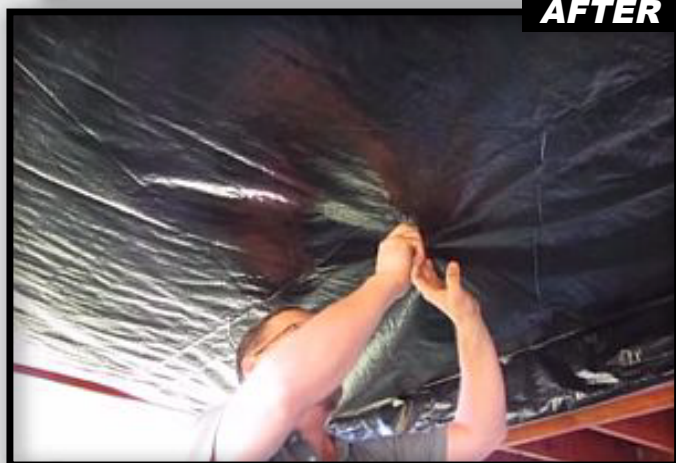

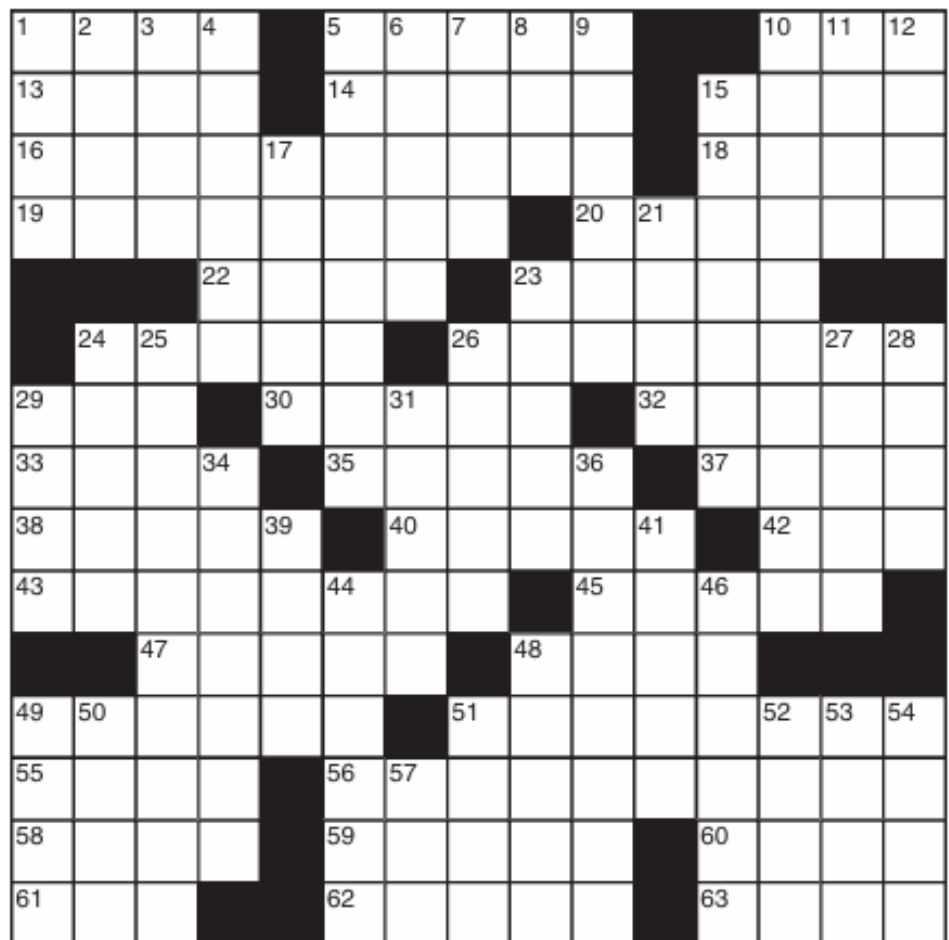

8-DAY HURRICANE EVACUATION PLAN

The Co-op Board of Directors would like all residents to be prepared for the upcoming storm season. Please heed notices that are circulated by local media outlets, your Lee County agencies, and your community organizations. As recent storms have shown, your key to survival could very well rest upon your level of preparedness. The association cannot emphasize enough the importance of each unit taking stock, beforehand, of your supplies and the need for a plan to evacuate when the authorities give the order. Remember – **THE CLUBHOUSE WILL BE LOCKED** – prior to and during a major weather event. When winds become sustained FORTY miles per hour, first responders must wait for the passage of the storm. If you have an emergency, you will be on your own until the authorities declare it safe for teams to travel. The following guidelines could prove helpful:

If given notice of a storm's potential development, assess your supplies.

- 8 days out – monitor the storm, check household supplies, locate a safe zone.
- 7 days out – monitor the storm, check home safety features, check fuel levels, have cash on hand in the event of loss of power in the area.
- 6 days out – monitor the storm, prepare your evacuation route.
- 5 days out – monitor the storm, finalize safety plans, prepare your home.
- 4 days out – monitor the storm, call contacts, evacuate if necessary.
- 3 days out – monitor the storm from the location which you have chosen.

*****PLEASE PREPARE AND BE SAFE*****

Hurricane Season is June 1st to November 30th

Recommended Items to Include in a Basic Emergency Supply Kit

- ☐ Water and non-perishable food for several days
- ☐ Extra cell phone battery or charger
- ☐ Battery-powered or hand crank radio that can receive NOAA Weather Radio tone alerts and extra batteries
- ☐ Flashlight and extra batteries
- ☐ First aid kit
- ☐ Dust mask, to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- ☐ Whistle to signal for help
- ☐ Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- ☐ Non-sparking wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- ☐ Can opener (if kit contains canned food)
- ☐ Local maps

Additional Items to Consider Adding to an Emergency Supply Kit:

- ☐ Prescription medications and glasses
- ☐ Infant formula and diapers
- ☐ Pet food, water and supplies for your pet
- ☐ Important family documents such as copies of insurance policies, identification and bank account records in a portable waterproof container
- ☐ Cash and change
- ☐ Emergency reference material such as a first aid book or information from www.ready.gov
- ☐ Sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person.
- ☐ Complete change of clothing including a long sleeved shirt, long pants and sturdy shoes.
- ☐ Fire Extinguisher
- ☐ Matches in a waterproof container
- ☐ Feminine supplies, personal hygiene items and hand sanitizer
- ☐ Mess kits, Paper cups, plates and disposable utensils, paper towels
- ☐ Paper and pencil Books, games, puzzles or other activities for children
