#### LaCasa Real Estate News

Sarasota Florida features a number of 55+ communities. Generally, La Casa, as are other similar communities, have what is considered a balanced market, but with a slight increase in inventory compared to last year. Our inventory is slowly going downward with less listings this past month than a year ago. 55+ communities are popular in FL due to the State's appeal for retirees and active adults. Because of the age restrictions of La Casa and other similar 55+ communities in Sarasota County are sought after locations. Also, the downside of age restricted communities, in general, is that it has a limited audience of people who are looking for homes.

That being said, in July, 4 homes were sold while last year in July, we sold only 1 home. Unfortunately, no lots were sold this month. At the end of the month, we have 1 house pending and 2 lots.

The average sale price of a home in July was \$149,000.

Tammie Schroder, our sales associate and broker, is available to meet with you if you are interested in listing your home with La Casa Real Estate. Remember, our commission is 4% rather than the 6%+ charged by outside realtors. Some residents feel that going with an outside realtor, there is more exposure to potential buyers. With LCRE being part of the Multiple Listing Service, potential buyers going to an outside realtor will also see your house listed through La Casa Real Estate. If LaCasa Real Estate shows and sells the house, it can be a significant difference in the commission you will be required to pay. If you home sold for \$150,000, with LCRE, your cost would be \$6,000. With and outside realtor, it could cost \$9,000 or more. An outside realtor probably doesn't know anything about our community and what it has to offer. The condition of the home is important to a buyer, but also important to a retiree is what are the activities that occur in the community on a daily, weekly or monthly basis. Our volunteer tours often sell the park and thus sell the home.

Remember LCRE when you need to make that decision to sell. Let us help you through the process.


