The wood and bolts for the barriers will be purchased in the next few days. A team of volunteers led by Albert Frick will cut the wood and drill the anchor holes. These panels will be stored until needed.

Since we will probably not have our new louvers until after this hurricane season, temporary plywood coverings will be ready if needed.

You might not have known that we have a Building Committee keeping tabs on all this stuff. Serving on the committee are Albert Frick, Rick Curwood, Gary Parker, Paul Gilmartin and Sandy Tulenko. Rick and Gary are Board cochairs.

Our 720 Pickleball Club has made outstanding progress so far

SVCA's new **720 Club** has made significant progress. We were able to renovate the existing dilapidated recreational pad into four pickleball courts with the hard work of dedicated volunteers and many donations.

The newly renovated courts consist of a fiberglass surface coat over an asphalt base. The courts have permanent nets which were donated by the Sarasota County Parks and Recreation Department from their Foxworthy courts which they were updating and replacing the nets. We reconditioned the nets and donated hardware and mustered a crew of volunteers to survey out the locations and excavate post anchors. The dedicated crew mixed and poured 'by hand' 52 bags of concrete (1.5 tons)!

The renovation was a joint effort between SVCA and the 720 Club and it's now ready for your use and enjoyment. The total cost paid out by us for the project was \$15,500.

However, without our wonderful volunteers who did so much of the labor and your donations, it would have cost \$37,000. That would be for the repair, resurfacing, and stripping of the court surface, permanent nets and hardware, and repair and reconnecting the perimeter fencing. That 'retail' cost would have included:

- 1) reconditioning of the surface \$15,500
- 2) four permanent nets and hardware \$12,000

- 3) eight concrete anchors for posts \$9,000
- 4) fencing repair \$500

So if you have been 'AWAY', and haven't seen or played on them, please come join us as our guest to try it out. We hope you find the facility welcoming, friendly and enjoyable for all levels from beginners to accomplished players.

We made arrangements with Chris Kiger, a licensed, insured, certified pickleball instructor to provide individual and group lessons for all levels. You can reach Chris at 720-810-6664 or ckiger2016@gmail.com.

We have future plans to build a shady waiting/queuing area with shade sails and posts, tiki hut bar for licensed outdoor events, as well as hardscaping patio and walkways and landscaping

The membership fee is \$70 / year and an additional \$30/year if you are interested in having the ability to invite friends and relatives outside your household to play with you.

The next planned project is anchoring five posts for hanging the shade sails and doing hardscaping of the walkway and patio/waiting area.

Key hurricane preparedness tips from Sarasota County's Emergency Services
As storm season approaches, take these steps to protect your home:

- Secure loose rain gutters and downspouts, and clear clogged areas or debris.
- Secure and reinforce your roof, windows and doors, including garage doors.
- Consider building a FEMA safe room designed for protection from high winds and flood waters.
- Learn how to turn off gas, water, electricity.

Checklist for Sheltering in Place

- Fill bathtub or other large containers with water.
- Drinking water, one gallon per person, per day, for at least three days.
- Canned food, a can opener and paper items
- Medications, prescriptions and a first aid kit.
- Battery-operated television or radio, flashlight and extra batteries.
- Cash (ATMs may be out-of-service).
- Pet supplies.
- Photocopies of important documents (birth certificate, license and insurance).
- Full tank of gas in car.

tumn vibes – crisp cool air, colorful leaves, and the scent of • apples in the kitchen. Growing up in Wisconsin, apple picking was a favorite family tradition that I have since shared with my kids. We'd head out to the orchards, fill our baskets with as many apples as we could carry, and of course eat a few along the way!

Brown Bag Apple Pie is a quirky recipe that I found years ago in an old community cookbook from Watertown, WI, near my hometown. The recipe was shared by Ms. Violet Chartier, and it's been on our Thanksgiving table ever since.

Yes, it really bakes in a paper bag! The bag traps steam, which keeps the crust golden and flakey, while allowing the apples to bake evenly, tender yet firm. I like using Granny Smith apples for their tart tang against the sweetness of the pie, but any apple you enjoy will do. The result

is a delicious apple pie with a gooey, warm, cinnamon spiced filling, in a buttery crust.

It's cozy, with old fashioned charm and a fun twist - perfect for fall gatherings. Give this pie a try. It just might become one of your family's traditions, too.

September is the beginning of apple Brown Bag Apple Pie

- 3 pounds apples about 7-9 Granny Smith apples or any variety you like
- ½ cup plus 2 tablespoons flour
- ½ teaspoon nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- ½ cup butter softened
- 1 9 inch unbaked pie crust

1 large brown paper bag

Instructions

- Preheat oven to 400°F. Move middle rack down a level.
- Peel and slice apples thinly.

Paper Bag Apple Pie Continued

- Toss apple slices with ½ c sugar, 2 tbsp flour, ½ tsp nutmeg, and 1 tsp cinnamon until each piece is coated.
- Fill pie shell with apples, piling high in the center creating a mound of apples. Apples will cook down.
- Sprinkle apples with lemon juice.
- Mix ½ c butter, ½ c sugar, and ½ c flour into a soft paste.
- Pat and spread the paste over the top of apples creating a crust.
- Place pie in brown bag. Close bag with clips or stapler, making sure the bag is not touching the top of the pie.
- Place bag on a foil lined cookie sheet in the center of

the oven. Make sure the bag is not touching the top or sides of the oven.

- Bake 1 hour and 10 minutes at 400°F.
- Carefully remove bag from oven and let cool in the bag for 10 minutes before removing pie from bag.
- Serve topped with vanilla ice cream or homemade whipped cream and enjoy!
