





OCTOBER IS BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH





Stavros Kountanis and wife Amanda immigrated from the Village of Mystras in Greece to Connecticut in the early 1970s. There, after he achieved culinary certification in Canada, they opened an Italian restaurant. But it wasn't long before Amanda had enough of the cold weather so they decided to move to Florida.

Fifty years later, Stavros and Sons, the family-owned business they started, is flourishing in two Lake County locations including Fruitland Park and Eustis.

It all started in 1974 when they opened the Original Stavros Pizza House in Daytona Beach. They continued to open additional locations within the area while raising their sons, Michael and Pete, but they sold their restaurants and relocated to the Leesburg area for a change of scenery more conducive to raising a small family.

The Kountanis family shared their love of Greek food with their adopted community by opening Stavros restaurants in Leesburg, Fruitland Park and Eustis. Eventually, Stavros and Amanda sold the Leesburg restaurant. Then, in 2016, they decided to step back and entrust their sons with running the remaining two locations. Their oldest son, Pete, and his wife, Heather, took on managing Stavros and Sons in Eustis, while George and his wife, Cyndi, manage the Stavros and Sons in Fruitland Park.

While Amanda and Stavros passed down their business, they are keeping themselves busy. Amanda splits her time between the two restaurants, helping where needed. Stavros rotates his time between the United States and tending to the family's olive grove in Greece.

ROCK - PAPER - SCISSORS

There's a good chance you don't even remember exactly who taught you how to play, but play you almost certainly did. It might seem like the game has existed forever, but like all things, it has a history, and it's introduction to American culture is surprisingly modern.

Rock Paper Scissors originated in China during the Han Dynasty (206 BC –

220 AD) as a Hand game called Shoushiling. The game later spread to Japan and eventually made its way to the west in the early 20th century.

A player who decides to play rock will beat another player who chooses scissors ("rock crushes scissors" or "breaks scissors"), but will lose to one who has played paper ("paper covers rock"); a play of paper will lose to a play of scissors ("scissors cuts paper"). If both players choose the same shape, the game is tied, but is usually replayed until there is a winner.

Rock Paper Scissors is often used as a fair choosing method between two people, similar to coin flipping, drawing straws or throwing dice in order to settle a dispute or make an unbiased group decision. In 2006, American federal judge Gregory Presnell, from the Middle District of Florida, ordered opposing sides in a lengthy court case to settle a trivial (but lengthily debated) point over the appropriate place for a deposition using the game of Rock Paper Scissors.

Given the popularity of the game and our tendency to turn hobbies into money-making opportunities, the existence of professional Rock Paper Scissors leagues should come as no surprise. Neither should the levels of recognition enjoyed by professional players and the tens of thousands of dollars in tournament prize money at stake.



The World Rock Paper Scissors Society hosted Professional Rock Paper Scissors Tournaments from 2002 to 2009. These competitive championships were widely attended by players from around the world and attracted widespread international media attention. WRPS events were noted for their large cash prizes, elaborate staging, and colorful competitors.

The World Rock Paper Scissors Association started in 2015, and has hosted professional Rock Paper Scissors tournaments all around the world. Several RPS events have been organized in the United Kingdom by media company, Wacky Nation. The 1st UK Championship took place on July 13, 2007, and were then held annually. The 2019 event was won by Ellie Mac, who went on to pick up the cash prize of £20,000 but was unable to double her earnings in 2020 due to the coronavirus outbreak.


At the heart of the most commonly used strategies lies a single notion: the only way to maximize your chances of winning a game of Rock Paper Scissors involves a complete random selection of moves that can be played with some degree of skill by recognizing and exploiting non-random behavior in opponents. Expert players observe and downplay natural human tendencies that might give away their game plan (think: physical tics that indicate you are choosing between a rock or a paper move, a smile or twinkle in the eye that when observed indicates which you may choose).

The Rock Paper Scissors game has stood the test of time. Not only has the game become part and parcel of differing cultures throughout history, but it has retained its flavor by virtually remaining unchanged in form and function: The rules are the same no matter where you play.



WHO WAS UNCLE HERSCHEL?

Since 1977, Cracker Barrel has incorporated a logo featuring an illustration of a man

wearing overalls (colloquially known as "Old Timer"), and resembling the company founder's, Dan Evins' real-life uncle, Herschel McCartney.

From August 19th through August 26th, 2025 Cracker Barrel revealed a simplified logo which received a lot of public criticism. The logo still featured the company's classic gold and brown color palette, but it removed the man seated next to a wooden barrel.

According to USA TODAY, the restaurant chain confirmed that the "new logo is going away" on August 26th and acknowledged the iconic man image would still appear on menus, road signs and at the country stores.

Uncle Hershel was the younger brother of Dan Evins' mother. He helped shape not only Cracker Barrel's image but also its values and was known as the soul of Cracker Barrel.

He was a wealth of knowledge about what rural America's old country stores were really like as he was a traveling salesman for Martha White Flour Company for 32 years, calling on many towns' general stores in the rural south.

Like many Cracker Barrels today, these general stores were more than just a place to purchase goods. They were a gathering place for folks to take a timeout from the chore-filled day to visit with a neighbor or two, exchange pleasantries or just talk about the weather.

After retiring, Herschel became a goodwill ambassador for Cracker Barrel, using his myriad stories and charm to build the brand's reputation for hospitality. He lived by the golden rule, "Treat everybody as you'd like to be treated yourself. Be down to earth, humble, soft-spoken, wear a smile and serve delicious food!" He was known for his genuine sincerity.

Controversy exists over the man illustrated in the logo. Who was he? Customers call him Uncle Herschel, but according to the Cracker Barrel

Insider, that's not the case. The man is just a generic figure that Nashville designer, Bill Holley, sketched on a napkin in 1977 with the goal of creating a feeling of nostalgia with an old-timer wearing overalls.

Though the resemblance seems coincidental, Hershel McCartney is honored for his contributions to Cracker Barrel with a memorial statue at the company's Home Office in Lebanon, Tennessee.

LET'S RETIRE FIRE

UNDERSTANDING THE RISKS OF FIRE

OCTOBER IS FIRE PREVENTION MONTH

WHY ARE OLDER PEOPLE AT RISK?

Older Americans are at risk for fire death and injuries for a number of reasons:

- They may be less able to take the quick actions necessary in a fire emergency.
- They may be on medication that affects their ability to make quick decisions.
- Many older people live alone and when accidents happen others may not be around to help.

FIRE HAZARDS

- Cooking accidents are the leading cause of fire related injuries for older people. The kitchen is one of the most active and potentially dangerous rooms in the home.
- The unsafe use of smoking materials is the leading cause of fire deaths among older people.
- Heating equipment is responsible for a big share of fires in seniors' homes. Extra caution should be used with alternate heaters such as wood stoves or electric space heaters.
- Faulty wiring is another major cause of fires. Older homes can have serious wiring problems, ranging from old appliances with bad wiring to overloaded sockets.

SAFETY TIPS

- **Kitchen Fires:** Most kitchen fires occur because food is left unattended on the stove or in the oven. If you must leave the kitchen while cooking, take a spoon or potholder with you to remind you to return to the kitchen. Never cook with loose, dangling sleeves that can ignite easily. Heat cooking oils gradually and use extra caution when deep-frying. If a fire breaks out in a pan, put a lid on the pan. Never throw water on a grease fire. Never use a range or stove to heat your home.
- Space Heaters: Buy only Underwriter's Laboratory (UL) approved heaters. Use only the manufacturer's recommended fuel for each heater. Do not use electric space heaters in the bathroom or around other wet areas. Do not dry or store objects on top of your heater. Keep combustibles away from heat sources.
- **Smoking:** Don't leave smoking materials unattended. Use "safety ashtrays" with wide lips. Empty all ashtrays into the toilet or a metal container every night before going to bed. Never smoke in bed.

Finally, having a working smoke alarm dramatically increases your chances of surviving a fire. And remember to practice a home escape plan frequently with your family.



Sting, The Way We Were, All The President's Men, and This Property is Condemned to name a few.

His key philanthropic efforts include founding The Redford Center to advance environmental awareness using film, establishing the Sundance Film Institute to support independent filmmakers, and preserving over 1.7 million acres of Utah wilderness, contributing to the creation of the Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument. He also supported causes like animal welfare, and participated in activism against the construction of a Utah coal-fired power plant.




