MESSAGE FROM MICHAEL WASHINGTON, PRESIDENT OF HOA

Hello Tropical Palms Residents, Some residents may be wondering why I am not back at Tropical



Palms yet. The reason is that while enjoying my vacation my heart went into an erratic heart rhythm called A-fib. I was in Weymouth Massachusetts. I was hospitalized in South Shore General cardiac care unit for four days, while Doctors tried to slow down my heart rate medications. Once my rate was slow enough and my blood pressure was high enough they decided to Cardiovert me. (Shock me with the paddles to stop my heart, hoping that it would start back up in a normal rhythm). It worked so I was released from the hospital and ordered to meet with my cardiologist. Since I didn't have a cardiologist it took me a week to find one that could meet with me in a timely fashion. I was extremely lucky, the Hospital Cardiologist took pity on me and accepted me as a patient. One week later I was wearing a cardiac monitor for two weeks and two weeks later I was to meet with him again and we would formulate a strategy for me to return home. 10 days into wearing the monitor I went back into A-fb. It was controlled A-fib because of the medication I am now taking. I am meeting with the cardiologist October 2nd hoping to set a date for an ablation. I will know more then, but I wanted you to know why I haven't returned yet. I want to thank Pam Timmins and the HOA board for all their help and support while I am absent. I assure you that I am fine and will be back just as soon as I can travel. Your humble servant.

DID YOU KNOW

The First Scheduled Commercial Airline Flight
The first scheduled commercial airline flight
took place on January 1, 1914, marking the birth of
modern commercial aviation.

The Flight

- Route: The flight traveled from St. Petersburg, Florida, to Tampa, Florida, across Tampa Bay.
- **Distance**: Approximately 21 miles (34 kilometers).
- **Duration**: 23 minutes.
- Aircraft: A Benoist XIV, a small biplane seaplane designed by aviation pioneer Thomas Benoist. It was powered by a 75-horsepower engine and could carry only one passenger alongside the pilot.

The Pilot

 Tony Jannus, an accomplished aviator and test pilot, was at the controls. Jannus was already known for his skills in flying and performing exhibition flights.

The Passenger

 Abram Pheil, a former mayor of St. Petersburg, was the first paying passenger. He won the seat through an auction, bidding \$400 (equivalent to over \$10,000 today).

The Airline

 The flight was operated by the St. Petersburg-Tampa Airboat Line, considered the world's first scheduled airline. The airline was founded by Percival Fansler, who believed in aviation's potential for practical and commercial applications.

Historical Significance

- The flight demonstrated the viability of using airplanes for commercial transportation.
- Although the St. Petersburg-Tampa Airboat Line operated for only about four months, it paved the way for the global commercial aviation industry.
- This achievement highlighted the growing capabilities of aviation and its potential to revolutionize transportation.


Legacy



THE STORY OF PUMPKIN SPICE:

From Kitchen Staple to Fall Obsession

When the air turns crisp and the leaves start to fall, one flavor seems to pop up everywhere: pumpkin spice. But where did this beloved autumn blend come from, and how did it make its way into our lattes, cookies, candles, and even breakfast cereals?

A Spice with a Long History

Pumpkin spice is a mix of familiar warming spices — cinnamon, nutmeg, ginger, cloves, and sometimes allspice. Though we now associate it with pumpkins, the blend has been used for centuries in European and Asian cooking. The spice combination was first popularized in North America in the late 18th and early 19th centuries when pumpkin pie became a holiday favorite.

In fact, spice companies like McCormick began selling pre-mixed "pumpkin pie spice" as early as the 1930s, saving bakers from having to measure each spice individually.

The Latte That Changed Everything

Pumpkin spice went from seasonal baking to popculture icon in 2003, when Starbucks introduced the Pumpkin Spice Latte (PSL). At first, executives weren't sure if people would go for it, but it quickly became the company's most successful seasonal drink of all time. Today, it's sold in over 50 countries and often signals the unofficial start of fall.

Beyond the Latte

- Once the PSL caught on, pumpkin spice spread everywhere:
- Coffee & tea pumpkin spice cold brew, chai, and cappuccinos
- Baked goods muffins, donuts, cheesecakes, and scones
- Savory twists pumpkin spice hummus and pasta sauces (yes, really!)
- Unusual finds pumpkin spice potato chips, dog treats, even scented cleaning sprays

Why We Love It

Scientists say pumpkin spice is comforting because it's tied to smell, memory, and tradition. The spices remind many of holiday baking, family gatherings, and cozy fall moments. No wonder it keeps coming back year after year.

So next time you sip a pumpkin spice latte or enjoy a pumpkin muffin, you're tasting more than just a trend

 you're savoring a tradition that's been warming kitchens (and hearts) for centuries.

Fun Fact: The Starbucks PSL didn't contain any real pumpkin until 2015 — before then, it was just the spice blend!

ASK DEE

Dear Dee:

I have been with my husband for many years. He recently retired and is having some minor health issues. I wait on him hand and foot and do everything in my power for him. I am patient and understanding with him. But it seems like he is always making underhanded little remarks that are very hurtful. When I react he tells me I am overreacting, that he is just joking. I just feel unappreciated and unimportant. He is kind to everyone else. Am I wrong to feel this way?

Dear Neighbor:

First of all, as I have said to so many people... you are NEVER wrong to feel whatever it is that you are feeling. Your feelings are yours, own them! It is understandable to be hurt when you are doing so much for a person and they make you feel devalued. The fact that he is fine with everyone else tells me that he is unhappy but is comfortable enough with you to let his guard down and show his true self. But that certainly does not make it fair to you!

As painful as your husband's behaviors may be for you, there is a very good chance that he is not even aware of the impact he is having. Some devaluing behaviors that people may impose on others can be insidious and the full impact may not even be recognized by neither the perpetrator nor the target. People can subtly devalue others through various behaviors that may not be immediately obvious. Here are some examples of how these actions can leave a negative impression:

Monopolizing Conversations: When someone dominates or interrupts every conversation, it can

make others feel devalued and insignificant.

Ignoring Eye Contact: Not making eye contact can send the message that the person doesn't care about someone's presence.

Constant Criticism: Continuously finding fault in someone's actions or appearance can damage their self-worth.

Gaslighting: Invalidating someone's feelings or perceptions can make them question their own sanity or reality.

Mockery: Making sarcastic remarks or laughing at someone's expense can belittle and humiliate them. These behaviors, while subtle, can have a significant impact on how other's mental health and well-being. We all have an inherent need to feel appreciated and valued for what we contribute to a relationship. However, there is a strong possibility that your husband doesn't even realize the impact he is having on you right now. I suggest that you sit your husband down, and have a calm conversation with him concerning the impact he is having on your peace of mind. Speak of your feelings, using "I" statements and be careful not to present as accusatory or blaming. Encourage him to talk about what is troubling him, perhaps this will help clear the air.


